

Project Update #3

Construction has been focused on several aspects of the project:

Site Works. Excavation is complete. The final blasted rock is being removed and engineered fill is being placed under the structural footings. All excavated materials have been stored on site. Parking lot has been cut back to subgrade level and lengths of storm drains placed. Sanitary lines and water lines have been installed.

Concrete. Formwork, rebar, and concrete placement of the suspended mezzanine slab is completed in the arena and the forms stripped, they are now working on the community room mezzanine section over the next two – three weeks. (see photo below)

Masonry. Masonry work has started. (see photo below)

Structural Framing. First deliveries of glulam's have arrived on site with installation planned for early to mid January. Prefab roof and wall panels are completed.

Local Labour. During the month of October Yellowridge Construction and the Sub Trades employed eleven individuals from the Hazelton/Kitwanga area and three individuals from the region for a total of 2464 hrs.

Community Celebration Event. The Owners Committee and the organizers wish to thank everyone that turned out for this event on Oct. 13th at the KTMA. The event drew members of the public, various dignitaries, elected officials, contractor reps, and donors.
